



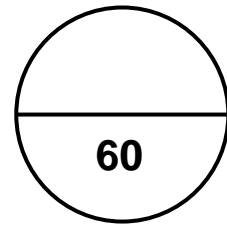

A Life in Fantasy – J.R.R Tolkien

1 J.R.R Tolkien is a name that most people have come to know after the success of the “Lord of the Rings” and “The Hobbit” films. J.R.R Tolkien was the pen name of John Ronald Reuel.

2 Tolkien took a keen interest in reading and quickly began to digest the great adventure stories. He showed a keen interest in languages especially Latin. He came across the idea of invented languages and he went on to produce his own alphabet. Later on, he created “Elvish” languages called Quenya and Sindarin, which became a primary part of the language that was spoken by the Elves in his books.

3 Tolkien was an English writer and scholar who achieved fame by writing a series of fantasy tales, set in a world of his own creation. These grew from a desire to tell inventive fantasy stories, influenced by a love of myths and legends. The longest and most important of those stories, began in 1930. While marking one day, he suddenly wrote down the words: “In a hole in the ground lived a hobbit.” This was the start to the famous fantasy story, “The Hobbit”. It revolved around a hobbit named Bilbo Baggins, a home-loving creature who is flung into an adventure to capture the treasure of the dragon named Smaug. Along the way, he comes across a ring which then becomes the central item in “The Lord of the Rings.”

4 In 1937, “The Hobbit” was published, and it was so popular that its publisher asked for a sequel. The result, 17 years later, was Tolkien’s masterpiece, “The Lord of the Rings”. A

few elements from “The Hobbit” were carried over, in particular, a magic ring, which revealed to be the ring, which must be destroyed before it can be used by the terrible Dark Lord, Sauron, to destroy the world.

5 “The Lord of the Rings” sold more than 50 million copies, in 30 languages. A film version was released in three instalments in 2001–2003 and achieved worldwide financial success. Thereafter, “The Hobbit” was then produced as a trilogy comprising the films: “An Unexpected Journey” (2012), “The Desolation of Smaug” (2013), and “The Battle of the Five Armies” (2014).

6 Tolkien’s ideas for “The Hobbit” were derived from his trip to Switzerland and had a huge impact on his future writing. The Misty Mountains from “The Hobbit” were based on those very mountains in Switzerland that he saw during his trip. His walks through the countryside with his friends helped to inspire passages in which Bilbo Baggins travels through this rocky landscape.

7 “The Hobbit” and its sequels have never been out of print and continue to influence the genre of fantasy to this day! Tolkien’s books have become the all-time favourites of thousands of readers. His books are creative and packed with adventure. At the same time, it reminds one of the never-ending battles between good and evil, love and loss and courage and betrayal, giving his books an ever-lasting appeal.

J.R.R Tolkien

1 John Ronald Reuel Tolkien achieved fame by writing a series of fantasy tales. He was born on 3 January 1892, in South Africa. He died on 2 September 1973 in England. Tolkien, his mother and younger brother, settled in England, after his father died in South Africa.

2 Tolkien was interested in invented languages and he created “Elvish” languages called Quenya and Sindarin. These became a primary part of the language that was spoken by the Elves in his writings. He was also interested in many other languages.

3 Tolkien achieved fame with his books, “The Hobbit” and “The Lord of the Rings” - a series of fantasy tales. These books were set in a world of his own creation. They also grew from a desire to tell stories which were influenced by his love for myths and legends.

4 “The Hobbit” was a famous fantasy story, that revolved around a hobbit named Bilbo Baggins. Bilbo was a home-loving creature who is flung into an adventure to capture the treasure of the dragon named Smaug. Along the way, Bilbo comes across a ring, which becomes the central idea in “The Lord of the Rings” series.

5 The sequel to this book, was “The Lord of the Rings”, which revealed the importance of the ring. A film version of “The Lord of the Rings” was released in three instalments in 2001–2003 and achieved worldwide financial success.

6 Tolkien’s enduring fame as the father of modern fantasy, made his books become the all-time favourites of thousands of readers. His books are written beautifully. They were creative and packed with adventure.
