	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Leave a contact number so that people can contact you and NEVER go anywhere with somebody you do not know (even if they say they know your parents or have been sent by your parents).</li> <li>• Tell your parents/caregiver where you are going and what time you intend to return.</li> <li>• Be careful about giving your personal details to anyone – this includes information requested on the internet.</li> <li>• Never arrange to meet somebody you have met on the internet without a trusted adult being present.</li> <li>• Be watchful when you are leaving school or your house – if somebody looks untrustworthy then trust your instincts and get away. It is far better for somebody to think you are crazy for running away than it is for a criminal to think you are stupid for sticking around.</li> <li>• Choose friends carefully and spend time with people who accept you as you are.</li> <li>• If you know of people at your school that are participating in activities that could put</li> </ul>	10	4

You can do this confidentially if you think they might hurt you for speaking out.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If somebody you know is being abused and is too scared or ignorant of their rights to speak out, then it is your social responsibility to report what you know to a trusted adult.</li> <li>• Have the courage to be yourself and don't be too embarrassed to say "No" to your friends when they ask you to do something that you know will place you in danger. Spending time with reckless and irresponsible people can place you in danger.</li> </ul>
